### READ CAREFULLY!

ALL FLOWERS FOR BOTH FLOWER SHOWS MUST BE REGISTERED ON ENTRY DAY MONDAY, JULY 31 FROM NOON TO 7 PM.

Bring actual flowers in on the days listed for the show you are entered in. Bring your own jars for display of flowers.

**RULES:**

- 1. Flowers must be grown by the exhibitor. The exhibitor shall not be in the business of supplying the flower or plant trade or markets in any way. Professional exhibitors may enter ONLY in the professional class listed.
- 2. All plants must be in possession at least three months.
- 3. Bring your own clear glass bottle for cut specimens. Cut specimens should not have any foliage below the water line.
- 4. Enter only the exact number of stems, spikes, stalks, specimens as listed. There may be more than one bloom on each stem, spike or stalk in its natural growing form, unless indicated on the schedule.
- 5. Unless indicated, an exhibitor may make more than one entry in a lot, ONLY IF each is a different genus, species, variety, cultivar, type, size or color.
- 6. The schedule is the law of the show. Carefully read and study the show schedule.
- 7. Judges decision is final.
- 8. All flowers and plants are to be left on exhibition until 5:00 p.m. Sunday.
- 9. The American flag may not be used in any floral display.

"Best of Show" will be chosen from all the champions at each show.

"Best of Show" will also be given to Class U for Professionals
