Judging will begin at 11:00 am on
Friday, August 2.

RULES:

1. Flowers must be grown by the exhibitor. The exhibitor shall not be in the business of supplying the flower or plant trade or markets in any way. Professional exhibitors may enter ONLY in the professional class listed.
2. All plants must be in possession at least three months.
3. Bring your own clear glass bottle

 5. Unless indicated, an exhibitor may make more than one entry in a lot, ONLY IF each is a different genus, species, variety, cultivar, type, size or color.
 6. The schedule is the law of the show. Carefully read and study the show schedule.
 7. Judges decision is final.
 8. All flowers and plants are to be left on exhibition until 5:00 p.m. Sunday.
 9. The American flag may not be used in any floral display.
